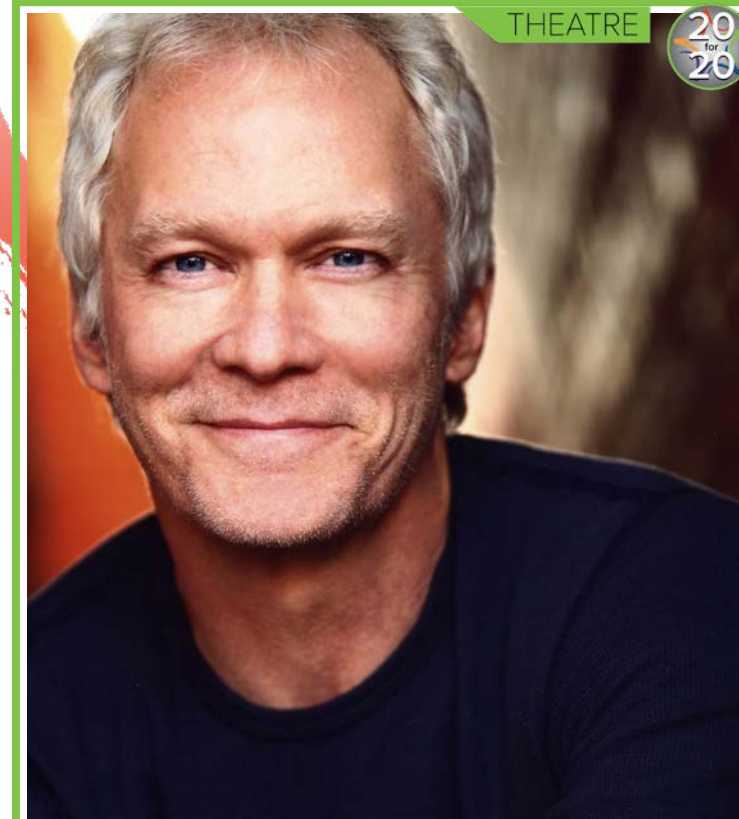


Art Talks - Undiminished: Elder Artists from Michelangelo to Jacob Lawrence
